Explore the Gravois Greenway:Kirkwood to River des Peres



WHILE YOU'RE EXPLORING

- » Learn about history at the Ulysses S. Grant National Historic Site, the Sappington House Museum, and Father Dickson Cemetery
- » Visit Grant's Farm to view wildlife and see the Clydesdale horses from the trail
- » Play on the playgrounds at Backstoppers Park or Officer Blake C. Snyder Memorial Park
- » Follow the wooded trail across Gravois Creek and around an old quarry in Whitecliff Park
- » Grab a bite to eat at Grant's Farm, The Barn at Sappington House, or any of the nearby restaurants on Watson Road or Bayless Avenue
- » View wildlife in the restored wetland habitat near the Mysun Charitable Foundation Trailhead

NATURE: Rainwater that falls in the 23 square mile Gravois Creek Watershed drains into Gravois Creek and flows from there to the River des Peres to the Mississippi River to the Gulf of Mexico.

CULTURE: Gravois Creek is named for the French word for "gravel" that gives this creek its rocky character.

HISTORY: The Gravois Greenway was once the Kirkwood Cutoff railroad built in the 1920s-30s.



Greenways are outdoor spaces connecting people and

places. Each greenway is unique, reflecting the character of the communities it connects. Greenways can include **trails, conservation projects** such as rain gardens and restored prairies, **amenities** like restrooms and drinking fountains, and **connections** to businesses, neighborhoods, parks, schools, waterways and transit. There are over 120 miles of greenways throughout St. Louis City, St. Louis County and St. Charles County for you to explore and enjoy.
