SHORT TRIP

- 0.75 miles **A** to **B** and back
- 15 minute walk/5 minute bike

MEDIUM TRIP

- 5 miles from **A** to Missouri River and back through **B**
- 2.5 hour walk/1 hour bike

TRAIL SURFACE

Greenway is asphalt trail separated from the road. Conservation area trail is natural surface separated from the road.



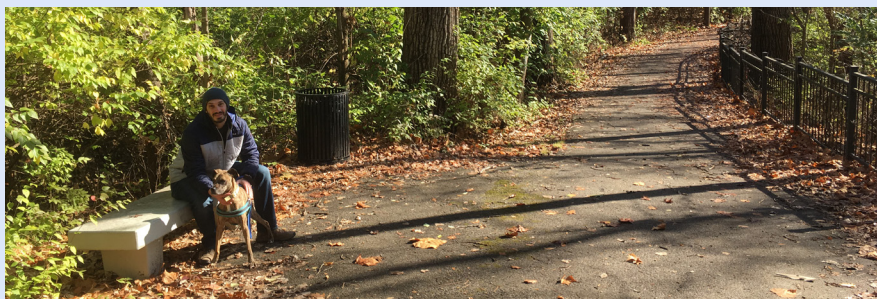

WHILE YOU'RE EXPLORING

- » Look for white-tailed deer, songbirds, birds of prey, and other wildlife along the greenway
- » Go fishing on the lake in Truman Park
- » Grill out, play on the playground, or play volleyball in Truman Park
- » Continue on the trails in Saint Stanislaus Conservation Area (note: some trail sections are very steep and some are prone to washout during floods)

NATURE: The woodlands along this section of the Missouri Greenway provide food and shelter for wildlife and improve air and water quality. They are also a great place for people to explore and enjoy the outdoors.

CULTURE: Truman Park is a community gathering place for enjoying summer concerts and fishing for bass and catfish in the lake.

HISTORY: Native American people lived in villages in the area for at least part of the year during the Middle Archaic period and continued to steward this land throughout many generations. French colonial settlers moved into the area in the 1600s followed by the Spanish in the 1700s and colonial settlers from the American South in the late 1700s.



Greenways are outdoor spaces connecting people and places. Each greenway is unique, reflecting the character of the communities it connects. Greenways can include **trails, conservation projects** such as rain gardens and restored prairies, **amenities** like restrooms and drinking fountains, and **connections** to businesses, neighborhoods, parks, schools, waterways and transit. There are over 120 miles of greenways throughout St. Louis City, St. Louis County and St. Charles County for you to explore and enjoy.
