We're staffing up our volunteer coordination team and developing a pilot for an Adopt-A-Greenway type program.




Along with our partners at the cities of St. Peters and St. Charles plus some federal funding, we're building that exact route right now!



Thanks to generous Great Rivers Greenway Foundation donors, the Projects Committee funded new bike fix-it stations, telescopes and other features along the greenways.

FOUR WAYS PARTNERSHIPS ARE INCREASING IMPACT:



The Mississippi Greenway: Old Chain of Rocks Park received a \$990,000 award from the National Park Service through the Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership program. (One of only 19 projects nationwide!) This historic site will get new security features, habitat restoration, nature-based stormwater management, and amenities for daily use and special events.



Great Rivers Greenway + City of Brentwood + Brentwood Bound Project = Deer Creek Connector is underway! This unique partnership means an extension of a greenway, connecting to major destinations and existing trails from Maplewood to Webster Groves to Brentwood.



St. Vincent Greenway has two sections under construction and one in design, thanks to collaborations with Missouri Department of Transportation, St. Louis County Parks, Bi-State Development, Cities of Wellston and Pagedale, plus federal dollars and private funders like Mysun Charitable Foundation.



Brickline Greenway is overflowing with partnerships — \$15 million in federal funding came in for the northern connection to Fairground Park, St. Louis Development Corporation + private philanthropy have funded an Equity & Economic Impact Director position, and stakeholders are coming together for block parties and cleanups along the way.
