Conservation projects to strive for healthier watersheds: rain gardens, native plants, restored prairies, wetlands and floodplain habitat.

Amenities like restrooms, water fountains, benches, bike racks, signs and parking.

Connections to businesses, jobs, transit, neighborhoods, schools, cultural destinations, rivers, creeks, parks and conservation areas.

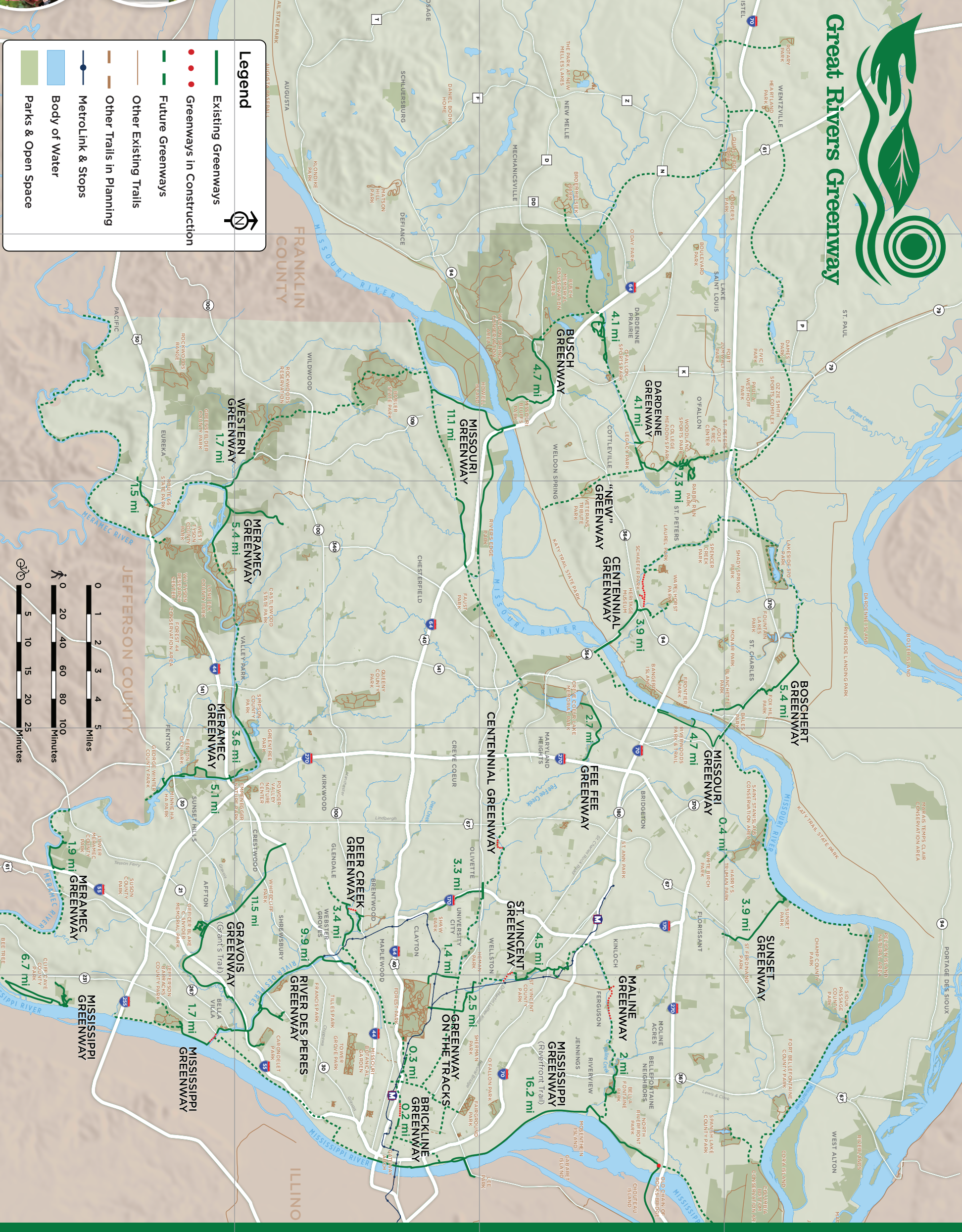
