A scenic overlook over the Meramec River will also be provided near the new trailhead.
Coordination with other uses within Unger Park, such as disc golf and fishing; Better access to the lake edge	GRG is working with the St. Louis Disc Golf Club to ensure the greenway complements the disc golf course. This project will also add an accessible dock and kayak access to the lake, which will provide better access to the lake edge for fishing and recreational uses.
Safety through design	This project will convert the north parking lot into a natural prairie. A higher-visibility trailhead (with parking) will be built in a more central location within the park.
