WHILE YOU'RE EXPLORING

- » Dine in the **Cortex Innovation District**
- » Less than a mile away, enjoy the cultural institutions in **Forest Park** and the shopping and dining in the **Central West End**

NATURE: The native-to-Missouri plants along the greenway provide essential nutrients and shelter for a diverse array of pollinators and the food webs that they support. The plant roots store excess rainwater and capture carbon.

CULTURE: The Brickline Greenway's connection to the Cortex MetroLink Station provides additional transportation options for the 20 million trips taken on Metro transit and 3 million trips taken on the greenways each year.

HISTORY: From 1849 to 1899, this was the location of the Rock Springs Cemetery. Many victims of the cholera epidemic were buried here, and their remains were later reinterred at Calvary Cemetery.



Greenways are outdoor spaces connecting people and places. Each greenway is unique, reflecting the character of the communities it connects. Greenways can include **trails, conservation projects** such as rain gardens and restored prairies, **amenities** like restrooms and drinking fountains, and **connections** to businesses, neighborhoods, parks, schools, waterways and transit. There are over 120 miles of greenways throughout St. Louis City, St. Louis County and St. Charles County for you to explore and enjoy.
