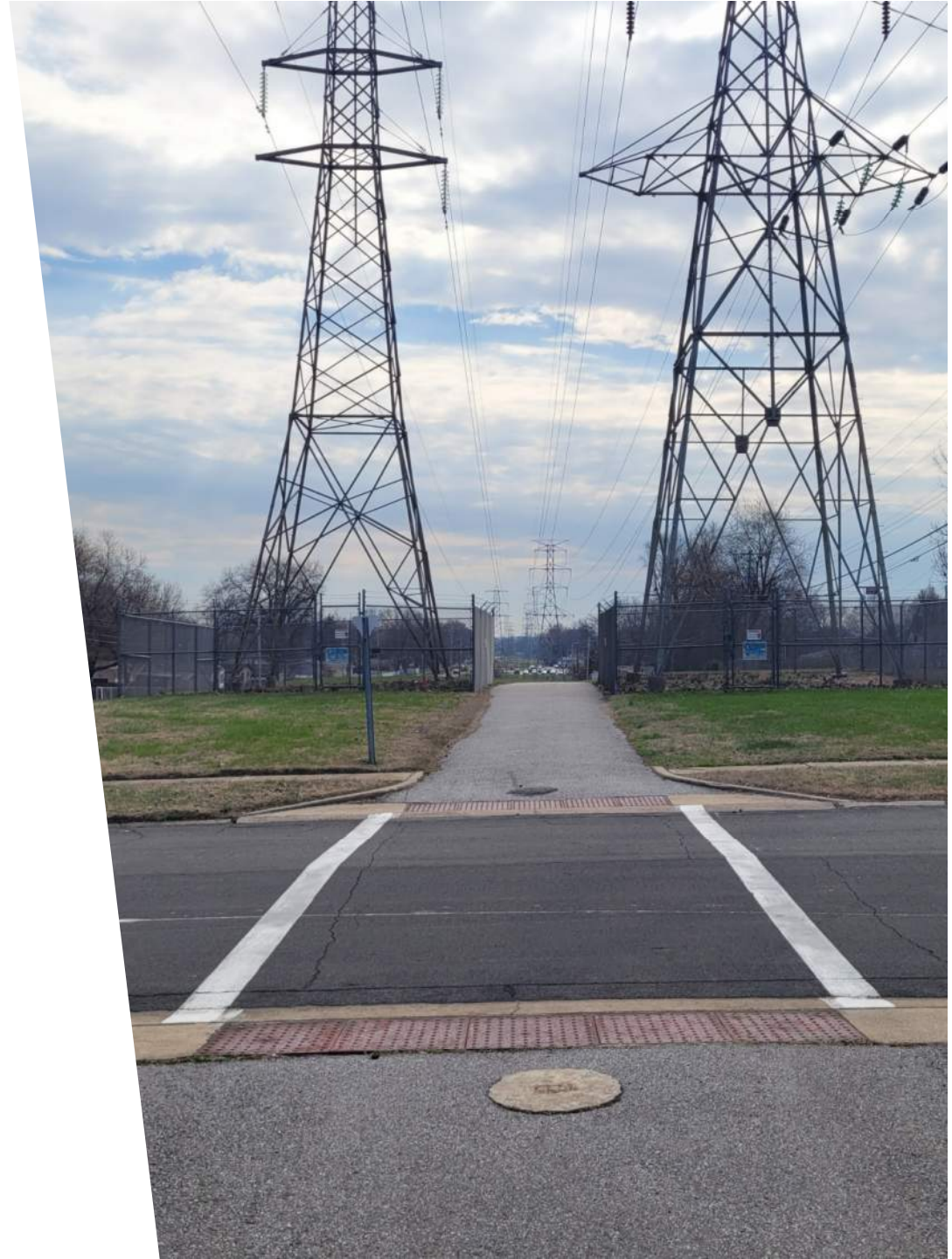

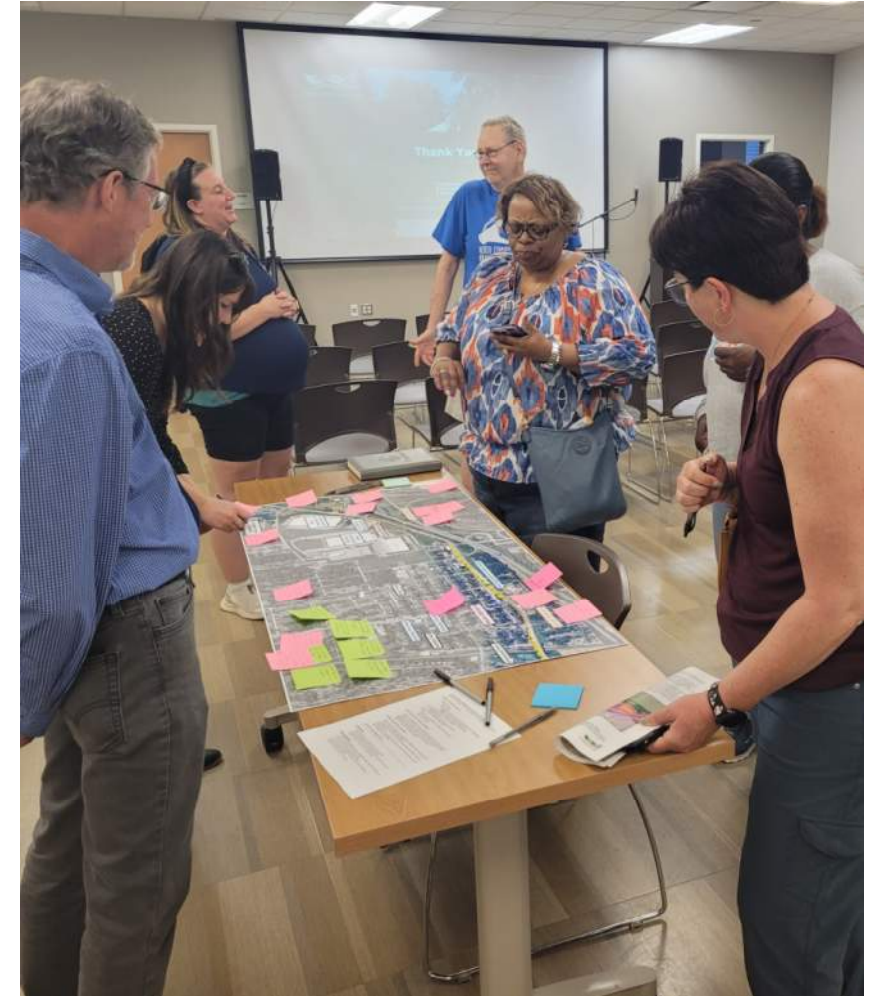

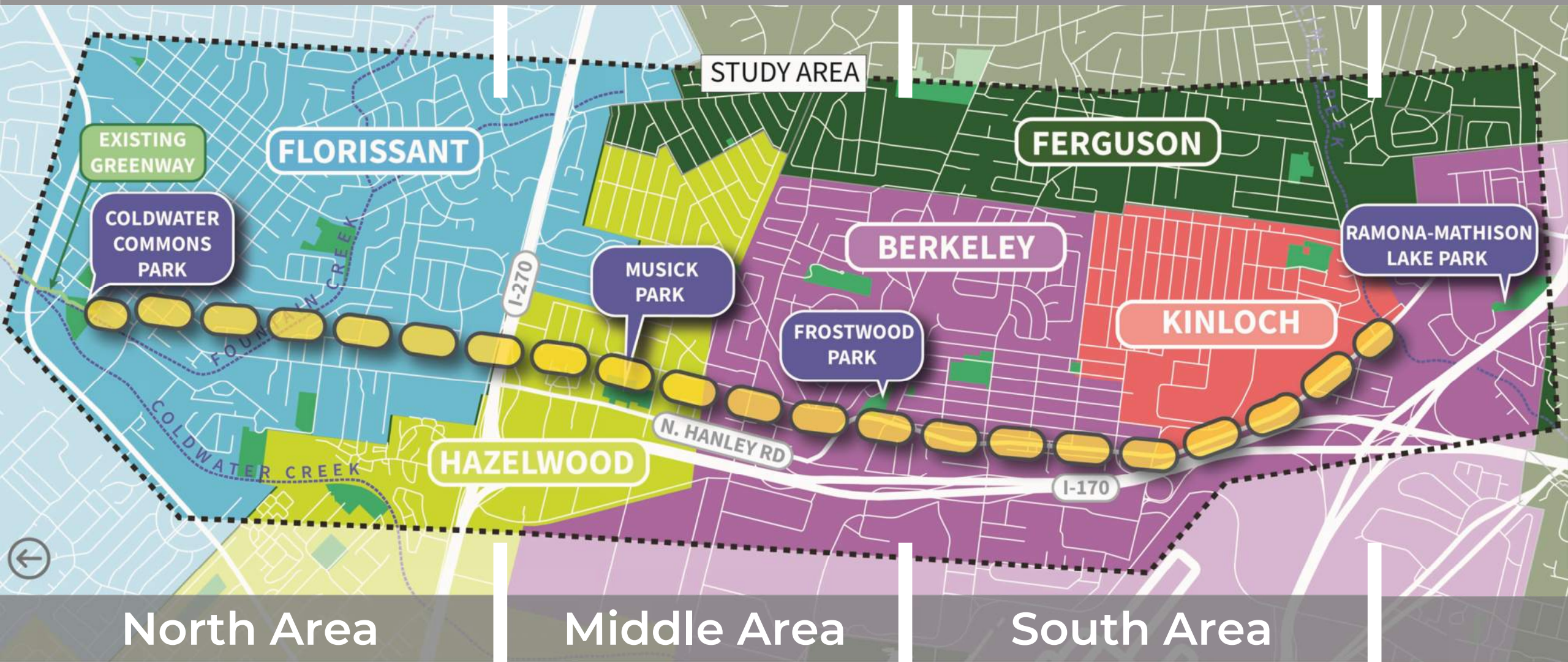
“Would love to see a trail or path that feels set back from the road and connects the park to the library or things like this that naturally feel like a way to create a fun family afternoon.”
